Perry County Basic Sanitation Ordinance - Public Health Nuisance Regulations

Sanitation standards applying to the control of health related public nuisances within the limits of Perry County, IL.

SECTION A. It shall be a public health nuisance:

1. To corrupt or render unwholesome or impure the water of any spring, river, stream, pond or lake, to the prejudice or injury of others.
2. To erect, continue or use any building or other place for the exercise of any trade, employment or manufacture, which, by occasioning noxious exhalations, offensive smells or otherwise, is offensive or dangerous to the health of individuals, or of the public.
3. To create any condition, through the improper maintenance of a swimming pool or wading pool, or the abandonment of any basement or crawl space, or by causing any action which alters the condition of a natural body of water, so that it harbors mosquitoes, flies, insects, rodents, nuisance birds or other animal pests that are offensive, injurious or dangerous to the health of individuals or the public.
4. To operate a tanning facility without a valid permit under the Tanning Facility Permit Act.
5. To permit any water well, located on property owned by him, to be in an unplugged condition at any time after the abandonment of such well for obtaining water.
6. To allow any other condition to exist which, in the opinion of the health authority, will constitute or pose a threat to the health of the public and/or environment.

SECTION B 1. Inspection procedures:

Routine Inspection by Environmental Health Inspector

1. Verify existence of nuisance condition and establish time period for compliance
2. Issue "Notice to Correct" by certified mail

Follow-up Inspection #1 by Environmental Health Inspector

1. Compliance - No further action required
2. Non-compliance
 - A. Determine and authorize time extension if partial compliance is shown
 - B. Issue "Notice to Correct" by certified mail
 - C. Refer for legal action if compliance is not shown

Follow-up Inspection #2 by Director of Env. Health / Administrator

1. Compliance - No further action
2. Non-compliance
 - A. Determine and authorize time extension if partial compliance is shown
 - B. Issue "Notice of Referral for Legal Action" by certified mail
 - C. Refer for legal action

SECTION C Penalty

Any person violating any provision of these regulations shall be punished according to Section 8-Penalty of the Perry County Basic Sanitation Ordinance 1981-1.

SECTION D Effective date

Under the authority of the Perry County Basic Sanitation Ordinance, the following program policies and procedures are hereby adopted. These policies and procedures shall pertain to the County of Perry, in the State of Illinois.
